## From the Pastor ...

Dear RVCC Members and Friends,

We are in the season of Advent. Despite all the glitter and glamor in stores, despite being inundated by Christmas messages on television and Facebook, despite the decorations and lights that are beginning to appear on the landscape, it is not Christmas time. It is Advent.

So, what is Advent? Advent is the season of the Christian year that prepares for Christmas. It lasts for about four weeks, beginning four Sundays before Christmas and ending on Christmas Eve. "So, Advent overlaps with what is usually thought of in American culture as the Christmas season. But its beginning and end are well defined, and its themes are quite different from what is commonly associated with secular Christmas celebrations.

## Summary of Tuesday, November 8, 2022 Coordinating Council/Deacons Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 by Tom Wiley. Present were Tom, Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Judy, Petra, Deb, and Nancy.

Deb offered the opening prayer.

Tom reviewed the agenda and set closing time.

Tom introduced Doug Bate. Doug is a member of a UCC Church in North Andover, Massachusetts. He has worked with Petra at the Waterford, ME Church. For most of his career, he has been self employed, working in the corporate world, helping businesses find themselves, and find a new direction in times of change. He can do the same for us. We need to stay relevant, and we may become a different kind of church. The answers need to come from us, but he can help us with the processs of finding a new vision and direction for ourselves. We need to think out a few years, not short term. We need to think big and see the world differently. As we commit, he believes resources will become available. As we create energy about the future, things will fall into place. It will help to hear what other churches have done. Rolf reminded us that we do a lot, but no one knows what we do, because we are terrible at P.R.

**Treasurer:** Brenda reported that October had been a good month. Income, and specifically contributions were better than budget.

#### Reports of the Coordinators:

Clerk: nothing to report

**Trustee:** Rolf reported that he replaced a CO2 detector in the Parsonage. He and Craig also replaced some lights on the outside of the church.

Missions: Caryl reported that we have received enough donated items to fill 12 ditty bags for Seafarers. In December we will be urging donations for Maine Seacoast Missions, and on Christmas Eve for the UCC Christmas Fun, formerly Veterans of the Cross. Judy reported that she has been in contact with the social worker for the Raymond Schools. We are giving them twenty \$40 Hannaford gift cards for those who need help with Thanksgiving dinner. We will also give them Walmart gift cards for those who need assistance at Christmas.

Christian Education: nothing to report

**Stewardship:** Petra extended thanks to Craig, Brenda, Bonnie, and Deb who all have spoken so eloquently about Stewardship over the past few weeks. Everyone remarked on the messages on All Saints Sunday, as well.

**Deacons:** Caryl shared that the beginning of Advent is coming up soon. The Christmas Eve service will be at 5:30 PM. There will be no worship on Christmas Day or New Years Day. We will offer something on our U tube channel, some music for the holidays.

**Moderator:** Tom thanked all who helped with the dinner and fun on Saturday night. It was a great evening.

**Pastor:** Petra shared that this Sunday we will be celebrating Chan Roach's 50 years of ministry. It should be a special service.

#### **Old Business:**

Halloween: A great success once again. Cora Sullivan counted 1068 kids. Winter Worship: January 1, no service; January 8, in person and communion; January 22, in person with annual meeting. January 15 and 29 – zoom. In February, the first Sunday in person with communion, rest via zoom. In case of bad weather on an in person day, it will switch to zoom. Update on change in Pastoral Hours: Petra is tracking her hours to see how reduced hours is working.

**New Business:** Craig will come to our next meeting to discuss plans for Pot roast suppers for next year. Caryl spoke briefly about the new Pastoral Compensation Recommendations from the Maine Conference. She will email the document to us for our review. **Weathervane** deadline will be 11/18, Lori will print on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. He was grateful for them and said he would be visiting the ships through Thanksgiving and Christmas and hand out the bags. He hopes to send Caryl a report about it the first of the year.

#### Missions in Our Local Community

**Note:** For the last couple of years the Food Pantry has worked with Our Lady of Perpetual Help to provide Thanksgiving baskets to Raymond Food Pantry Patrons. Our mission for Thanksgiving and Christmas is to help families identified by the Raymond School System. We have provided Hannaford Gift Card to the Raymond Schools for them to provide to families in need of assistance with a Thanksgiving meal. We will provide Wal-Mart Gift Cards to the schools at Christmas time.

#### Maine Seacoast Mission Christmas Wish List - Due December 4th

Following a custom that began more than 100 years ago, when the Mission brought gifts to island residents and lighthouse keepers, the Mission distributes holiday gifts to children, families, elders, prisoners, and nursing home residents at Christmas time. Generous donors bring or send new items to the Mission throughout the year to be distributed throughout the communities, and the Elves' Workshop gives families the chance to choose gifts for one another. Gifts are wrapped, as per Mission tradition, in white parchment paper tied with red string. How can we help? Two ways and both need to be completed by December 4<sup>th</sup>

#### <u>December Mission - Christmas Fund</u>

On December 24<sup>th</sup>, envelopes will be available to make an annual contribution to the Christmas Fund. The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund is a Special Mission Offering that congregations have been supporting for over 100 years. The offering is administered through the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance, the charitable arm of the Pension Boards. Funds provide direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties. Active and retired clergy, lay employees, and their surviving spouses may be eligible for the Supplementation of Small Annuities, Supplementation of Health Premiums, Emergency Grants, and/or Christmas "Thank You" Gift Checks.

## Late December through January - Heat Assistance

As we are all aware, the cost of fuel of any type for heating is much higher this year. We want to help others, but, as a church, do not really know how to determine who should receive funds. The Missions team has decided to send \$2000 to the Raymond fuel assistance program. At the same time, we also realize that some of our own RVCC members or friends may be trying to find the money for fuel as well. If you have already exhausted the resources available from the town or other, please contact Pastor Petra to discuss your needs. We want to help you if we can.

# **STEWARDSHIP**

We are now in the season of Stewardship, where we look to budget our operations for next year. If you have not received a Pledge card, or need a replacement card, you can use the one I have included in this article for the Weathervane. Pledge cards can be mailed to the church to the attention of Nancy Yates, at PO Box 285, Raymond, Me. 04071. Alternatively, your card can be brought to church and placed in the offering plate, or you can make a pledge online through PayPal and set up automatic contributions on a weekly, monthly or one time basis.

Our current financial situation, assuming that we will budget a deficit again for 2023, means that we only have enough cash in our General Fund to provide for operations through mid-year 2024, without liquidating other assets. This is not a surprise. We expected, when we initially hired Pastor Petra, that we would only be able to operate financially for 3 years, or until June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. We have therefore been able to better this by one more year. The decisions that we make in 2023 will determine the future of Raymond Village Community Church. We welcome your participation in the support and planning for our church.
