#### From the Pastor, continued . . .

It is hard to put to words (and so I share pictures) all the ways that the Holy Spirit moves in this place as we immerse ourselves in an embodied experience of nature, community, and worship. While we have a habit of saying that camp is "magic" and that we leave the "real world" behind when we are at camp, I have had the gift of bearing witness to the results when we intentionally



enter time when the overarching goals are to "Love God, Love Each Other, and Love Ourselves." The Holy Spirit showed up when campers and volunteers sat together in a circle to address conflict. They were able to both speak from their own perspective and see the impact of the conflict on others in the circle as each person took the risk of being vulnerable with the rest. The Holy Spirit showed up when campers sat in tears as they watched a peer struggle with a chronic health condition. In my effort to comfort them, they responded, "but it's not fair that she has to go through this." They were right. I watched their hearts open with empathy as they witnessed the challenges of another.

The Holy Spirit showed up when small children provided a worship service for their parents and elders, reminding them that God manifests in the form of Hope. The children dusted the cheeks of their grandparents with colorful bits of "Hope."

The Holy Spirit showed up last night when the staff sung a lullaby to campers down our long row of cabins, "Lord prepare me to be a sanctuary." God is in these shared moments of collective stillness and peace. I know that so often we wring our hands and wonder, "What is the future of the church?" Friends, the future is here. You are invited to come be part of it!

#### **CO** Detectors for Raymond Residents

In 2019, Raymond Fire and Rescue Association joined "Sound the Alarm", a program of the American Red Cross. They installed free smoke alarms in any home in Raymond – regardless of the socio-economic background of the occupants. They quickly realized the same residents needed CO detectors. Raymond Village Community Church stepped in to fund the purchase of CO detectors in memory of Lew and Betty Somers who died in August 2011 from carbon monoxide poisoning. We sent \$300 to Raymond Fire and Rescue Association to fund CO detectors this year.

#### Looking to the future, this year...

Since the June 11, 2023 Congregational Meeting:

- The pastoral search continued. The second resume resulted in an interview and potential to call the candidate. However, after talking with the candidate, it became clear that we did not fully understand the level of change in the new pastoral compensation guidelines adopted at the December Maine Conference meeting. This led the search committee and council/deacons to have an in-depth discussion about what we could afford with our current cash on hand (about a year for a pastor with <10 years' experience). All agreed it was time to update the congregation on 7/30 and ask for adoption of the resolution to sell the parsonage.
- We are seeking additional coverage for the pulpit in September and October.
