## From the Pastor ...

As I write this newsletter, the snow has been gently falling for the last several hours. All is quiet. It is beautiful to watch the snowflakes coming down at a steady pace.

Weather conditions can be a metaphor for how life can go for us.

For the last two and half years, I have been joyfully serving you as a threeyear designated term pastor, which ends this coming June 1st.

YOU, the congregation, have been walking the journey with me since my dad died in November 2020, followed by my mom in August 2022. I can't thank you enough for accompanying me on these significant life transitions.

It is tough to share with you that I will not be able continue as your pastor beyond June 1st. Many of you know that the red tape in Germany has complicated almost every aspect of my parent's estate. Unfortunately, this will require more time over the next year or two to address all the issues that have come up.

One example that some of you might remember is when the funeral home did not initially want to issue a death certificate for my mom. We needed to provide more proof that my mom was indeed the person they had in their possession.

I am reminded of Ecclesiates3:1,4

To everything, there is a season,

A time to weep and a time to laugh;

A time to mourn,

and a time to dance;

Although I am sad to leave, I look forward to being in ministry together for another four months. During those four months, you will begin discerning your next step for the future of RVCC. In addition, it is an excellent time to reflect on how God's presence has been revealed to you and how it might help this church.

It is a privilege to be part of this congregation, which, with the help of God, is riding this rollercoaster journey we call LIFE together.

#### Summary of Thursday, January 5, 2023 Coordinating Council /Deacons Meeting

The meeting of the Coordinating Council/Deacons was called to order at 5 PM, on Thursday, January 5, 2023. Present were Tom, Rolf, Brenda, Deb, Petra, Caryl, Nancy, Judy, and Bonnie.

Tom offered the opening prayer.

The agenda was reviewed, closing time of 6:30 PM was suggested.

**Treasurer's Report:** Brenda reviewed the budget for 2023. She is pleased that people seem to be keeping up with their pledges. Proposed budget deficit for 2023 is \$14,222, less than this years proposed deficit of \$23,231. With cash in the general fund of \$13,296, and the current American Funds balance of \$18,679, we have the resources to continue for two years if numbers in this budget hold true. This budget is assuming pastor expenses of 6 units. It is also predicting substantial increases under Trustees for cleaning, heating, and electricity.

#### **Reports of Coordinators:**

Clerk: nothing to report

**Trustees:** Rolf reported some furnace problems but they have been resolved.

**Missions:** Caryl reported that we had collected \$285 for the Christmas Fund, a UCC offering to help retired clergy. Our mission project for January is to help the town of Raymond with a donation to their heat fund.

Stewardship: nothing to report

**Deacons:** Caryl reported that after the annual meeting on January 22, we will worship in the sanctuary on only the first Sunday of each month, other Sundays will be via zoom. Easter is on April 9, decision on whether to be in person by then will be made at later date.

**Moderator:** There was discussion on logistics of annual meeting, there will be a pot luck lunch.

**Pastor:** Petra announced that she will be away on the first two Sundays in February. Chan Roach will preach and do communion on February 5. February 12 will be a prerecorded zoom worship with Michael and Caryl. Leslie Ann Chatfield will cover pastoral needs while Petra is away.

#### **Old Business:**

**New Business:** It was agreed that an announcement of Petra's leaving at the end of her contract will be made at the end of worship service for the next two Sundays.

Reasoning behind this is to allow time for this announcement to sink in before we discuss next steps at the annual meeting. The agenda for the annual meeting was discussed. A number of suggestions on how to move forward after Petra leaves were discussed by the Council. Several options were developed to present at the annual meeting.

The Weathervane will be printed on January 26, deadline for getting information to Judy and Deb for it is January  $20^{\text{th}}$ . Our next meeting will be 2/9/2023, at 6 PM in person.
