From the Pastor ...

"Who's the New Guy?"

Reverend Brian Donovan is a second career, open and affirming pastor of the United Church of Christ. His first career was in the construction trades as a ceramic tile installer / owner / operator where he also worked as a framer, marine electrician, and any other trade needed to get the work done as most contractors do in Maine. However, this career focus changed in 2011 when Brian returned to university to follow his calling as a pastor and his love of literature.

During Brian's time at the University of Maine in Augusta, he focused on literature and creative writing. Over those following years, he served as an academic tutor, on the Terry Plunkett poetry Festival Committee, and became a published poet / short story / graphic artist writer. All of these skills of both teaching and writing help Pastor Brian in God's ministry today as they help him share and understand the Word in light of our current culture. The time at university was definitely a blessing as it also helped Brian witness the multitude of perceptions which people hold. Still, God called Brian forward.

Following University, Brian completed a nearly thirty-year pilgrimage of the Spirit when he finally found the UCC. Brought up Roman Catholic and walking amongst a variety of faiths, Brian could see God in and throughout all of them. Preferring Jesus' teachings (especially the parables and the story of Legion), Brian looked for who God was calling Brian to lead. It was in those months after university, that Brian was shown the Open and Affirming beliefs of a UCC church. 'That moment was like the veil dropping,' Brian recalls as he finally found a community where ALL humanity is accepted and affirmed as a child of God. From there Brian went to a few Maine School of Ministry classes before heading to Andover Newton and finally Boston University school of Theology where he graduated with a Master of Divinity.

Since then, Pastor Brian has served a multitude of ministries which have all added to God's calling through Brian. These ministries have been as chaplain and pulpit supply to shared ministry between two Methodist communities in Maine. He has also served with other pastors in Massachusetts and as a settled pastor and teacher in New Hampshire. Between these ministries, his time in seminary, and his lifelong pilgrimage, Brian has found that God's love truly is for ALL people regardless of who they are or where they are on life's journey. "This Creator is who I serve as I serve the faithful people who are willing to walk with me on this journey of life. I pray that you are the person who will walk with me with an open and affirming heart which is willing to love all people, regardless of how they identify, who they love, or what they have done in life. Moreover, I hope we will ALL stand up for people - for ALL the children of God - and oppose those in our world who deny or refuse anyone from the kin-dom of God for these people are what we define as sexist, violent, oppressive, hateful, or homophobic. Yes, these souls are still children of God, but it is important to remember you cannot hate or mistreat another person and call it love - only LOVE is LOVE and that is the gift from God."

Pastor Brian is married to Angel, and they live in Freeport, Maine currently. The two of them have many brothers, sisters, and children who are biological, step, and in-law. As such, Pastor Brian simply considers them all family and forgets about the "silly" adjectives to describe his family. "That is my brother or our children," he has been heard saying to describe Angel's biological brother or children. The two of them also have three grandchildren and two more on the way, God willing. In the end, love is our bond and covenant with one another. "A love," Brian has said, "that took me fortyeight years to find." May God continue to guide us by their Love - in ALL things.

Summary of October 6, 2023 Coordinating Council Meeting.

The meeting was called to order, via zoom, at 6:00 PM, by Tom Wiley, Moderator. Present were Tom, Brian, Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Judy, and Deb.

Tom offered the opening prayer. The agenda was reviewed, close time set at hopefully 6:45.

Treasurer Report: Brenda reported that cash is still good, we remain close to budget.

Trustee Report: Rolf reported that after a couple of noisy Sundays, a battery has been replaced in the fire alarm system. Rolf also announced that, except for the optical card, the organ has been repaired. Michael is excited to play it, and Rolf will contact a local gentleman who had expressed interest in playing it. Brenda is not concerned about the close to \$2,000 bill, Caryl will contact some people who may be interested in donating toward the repairs. Rolf also announced that Nate and Deb have a place to move to on November 1. Rolf is getting a dumpster in as soon as possible, and will try to line up some scouts to help clear out the basement of the parsonage. Rolf will also contact the state that the money toward rent which we have received from the state, will go elsewhere.

Stewardship: Stewardship Sunday will be on November 19. Brenda will get a Stewardship letter out before then, possibly with quarterly statements. We will be putting pledge monies only to the general fund this year. We do not need it for missions, and having separate pledge toward cleaning has been confusing.

Pastor: Brian has met with Tom and Caryl this week, he will meet with Lori next week. They have gone over membership lists. Prayers are requested for Charlotte Rowe.

Missions: We will be in touch shortly with the Raymond Schools about families who may need help this year with putting a Thanksgiving meal on the table. As in the past, we will donate \$40 gift cards to families which are identified by the school's social worker. Caryl announced that we will also be working with Maine Seacoast Mission to provide items for their Christmas Wish List. RVCC people will be able to go onto Amazon and select items which they have indicated they need, then Amazon takes care of delivery, not us. An easy way to support a cause which we have worked with for a number of years.

Deacons: Caryl announced that All Saints Sunday will be celebrated on November 5. We will remember Anita's son, Brenda's mother, and Rolf's brother. Caryl clarified that coffee hour on October 22 will be after the 11:00 AM service. Coffee hour on the 29th will be before the service, with something available after as well.

Old Business: The tape of Brian's interview with the Salem Church, which many of us have seen, is now available on our You tube channel. There will be a congregational meeting after church on the 15th, to discuss upcoming changes and concerns. Chan will be preaching on October 8, 15, and 22nd. Caryl and Tom have met with Deb Lafond about the transition service on October 29th. Brenda will do a press release on Brian.

New Business: We have received an invitation from the Gray church to rent a table at their holiday fair. We will put it out to the whole congregation to see who might want to participate. Brian attended a training/orientation session at the Conference office. He has met the conference minister, and other new pastors. Caryl talked some about the upcoming conference annual meeting, which she and Brian will attend. She also talked some about the changes at the conference level that were made at last year's conference annual meeting. She made it clear that those changes to pastor's salaries and housing, were made by the Maine Conference, and not at the national level. The Weathervane will be printed on October 26th. Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, November 7, in person. Brian offered a closing prayer.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:55 PM.
