For the months without a permanent pastor, this section of the Weathervane will include articles submitted by the Deacons. This article is from Deacon and Moderator Tom Wiley with a special greeting from Pastor Brian Donovan

It is my pleasure to prepare this month's feature article. It is with excited anticipation that I have announced the hiring of our new pastor. Our new pathway to spiritual leadership will be directed under the guidance of Pastor Brian M. Donovan.

Pastor Brian will officially begin on October 30th and will lead from the pulpit on the first Sunday in November. But his work has already begun as he leads us into the next chapter of the life of Raymond Village Community Church.

In preparation for the first worship service, Pastor Brian will be reviewing our merger survey, reaching out to local pastors and also learning about our membership in the month preceding the official start date. process. Additionally I would provide encouragement with the words from Hebrews 13:8 "which tells us Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." So despite new beginnings, the foundation of which we believe is still intact.

Philippines: "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything lest your requests be made known to god." I like this reminder as so often when transitions happen in our world we do become anxious, worried, afraid of what the future will hold. It is a normal human reaction to changes.

I even asked the search team of Raymond Village what change meant to them and believe it or not their answers were scary, worrisome, and the like. I assume their answers are probably similar to the answer you may have if I were to ask you the same question: what does change mean to you?

But, it does not have to be. Paul reminds us of this truth: that we do not need to be anxious or concerned for the future because "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." It is just us humans that need to continually change, no - improve, to become more like Christ in each generation. And that does not seem scary anymore does it? If we think of all of these transitions that come into our life as not worrisome changes but simply as ways that God is guiding us to become more Christ-like; then the transition seems well exciting, joyous, Grace filled even. And that dear friends (I cannot wait to meet), is how I see what God is creating for us now. It is like a Christmas present sitting under a tree which we do not know what it is or what it will look like. I am not even sure we can say we have seen the wrapping paper. But, we know that the gift is from God and therefore it will be wonderful when we finally get to open it up and see where we end up - together.

### Summary of September 19, 2023 Coordinating Council and Deacons Meeting

Present: Tom, Caryl, Brenda, Rolf, Judy, Deb, and Brian Tom called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM, Tom offered the opening prayer. He introduced our new minister, Brian Donovan to Rolf and Brenda, who had not met him yet.

The agenda was reviewed, end time of 6:30 was suggested.

**Treasurer's Report:** Brenda presented financial reports for July and August. She reported that income and expense look to be about where they should. Cash is good, better than budgeted. She let Brian know that she does more in depth financial reports quarterly. Brenda also reported that between herself, Andy Morrison, and Catherine Berry, they are covering the financial job which Nancy Yates has been doing.

#### New Business: Introduction Plan

We will begin the Introduction process on October 1, Rev. Jane McIntyre will be preaching, still at 10 a.m. After church in the knitting room, Rolf will be playing the video of Brian Q/A with the Salem Church. On October 15, Chan will be preaching, still at 10 a.m. After church, there will Congregational Meeting with Council and Search Committee members to answer questions, discuss impact of changes etc.

Deb had offered to work on designing some signs. She feels we really need to emphasize the new start time of 11:00 a.m. We will begin new start time on 10/22. Chan will be preaching, and congregation will be introduced to new Pastor, Brian Donovan. There will be coffee hour after church, possibly with special desserts, to get to know Brian. Deb Lafond will be preaching on 10/29, that will be a transition service. There was discussion on whether to have coffee hour before or after church, since new start time will be at 11 a.m. It was suggested trying coffee hour before church, and feel out whether people want to stay and visit after church as well. Cherie needs to be informed of new time for coffee hour. Coffee hour before church will start on 10/29.

There needs to be further coordination with the Gray church, as we move forward sharing a minister. There are things we can do to ease the burden on Brian, for example, order of service and at least portions of Sunday bulletins should be the same.

For the Sundays which Brian has off, Windham Hill Church has services at 9:30. Some Raymond people may want to attend services in Casco. Brian's first service will be November 5, that will also be All Saints Sunday. Stewardship Sunday will be 11/19, we need to be thinking about Stewardship message. Tom may do something.

#### Reports of the Coordinators:

Clerk: nothing to report

Trustees: Rolf has taken the tarp down from the Patio. He has discovered electrical problem in the vestry, there are some plugs covered by tape, they can not be used. Rolf has spoken with our tenant next door. They are still working on finding new place to live, no luck yet. In the meantime, Rolf has offered to provide them with a dumpster to help clean out the basement. May need some help hauling stuff out. We can not get an appraiser in there until the basement is cleared. Rolf is going to start working on finding someone to plow for the winter. He would like to clean up the parking lot, identify some handicap parking spots, and do some stripeing.

Missions: Caryl reported on upcoming projects, working with local schools to help them provide needy families with what they need for Thanksgiving and Christmas; as well as working toward providing Maine Seacoast Misssions with Christmas gifts.

**Stewardship:** Rolf reported that he and Craig would like to host a thank you dinner for those who helped with Pot Roast Supper this year.

**Deacons:** With Nancy and Bob moving away, we are short on Deacons. Sarah Allen has offered to help some. Bill Feagans and Dermott Bostock have offered to help with taping. Caryl announced that Windham Hills Church will have an Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service on November 20, the Monday before Thanksgiving. All are welcome to attend and/or join the choir.

Moderator: Tom attended a meeting on Monday evening at the Gray church with Brian, the moderator from the Gray church, and Marcia Charles, the head of the Cumberland Association Committee on Ministry. Marcia urged both churches to make things as easy as possible for Brian as we embark on sharing a pastor. Brief discussion on updating our website, and when to reactivate our facebook page.

**Pastor:** Brian is going to the Conference Annual Meeting, he will represent both churches. Caryl is also going.

Brian offered a closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 6:30 p.m. Next meeting will be Thursday, October 5, at 6:00 p.m., via zoom.

#### **Coffee Hour**


