Summary of Tuesday, January 16, 2024 Coordinating Council Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 PM on Tuesday, January 16, 2024, via zoom by Rolf Olsen in place of Tom. Present were Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Pastor Brian, Judy, and Deb. Tom joined us shortly after the start of the meeting.

Caryl shared opening prayer, music "God holds future in his hands".

Treasurer's Report: Brenda shared fourth quarter report of 2023, no surprises. She reported that she forgot to add interest income from sale of Parsonage into figures for 2024. This will be corrected, interest is expected to be about \$8800. It will not be put in the American Funds. She did report that she recently had to withdraw from American Funds for cash flow purposes.

Deacons: Caryl reported that she is stepping down from position as Head Deacon, although she will continue to serve as a Deacon. Duties have been divided up among all Deacons, there will not be a Head Deacon. Sarah Allen will help out as available. Caryl was thanked for her service as Head Deacon.

Missions: Caryl is resigning as head of Missions. She does not want to be listed as part of the Mission team, although she will continue to do some mission work. She reported that we have completed our financial commitments to the Fuller Center. Judy will step up as head of Missions, she has met with Caryl and Pastor Brian, there will be some changes in what we can do.

Moderator: Tom thanked Caryl for her work in Missions, as well as for serving as Head Deacon. He reported that he had given Michael an extra weeks pay for his extra time during Advent.

Trustees: Rolf reported on various problems during recent storms. There was water in the vestry, although not as much as in previous storms. There was also damage to the Weathervane. He has met with contractors and insurance company representatives, still waiting on final numbers. Rolf reported that he hopes for a closing on the Parsonage in early February, if not sooner. Rolf asked for a motion to approve him to sign papers at the closing. A motion was made by Caryl Gilman, and seconded by Brian Donovan to allow Rolf to sign papers to close on sale of the Parsonage. The motion was approved. Rolf is also clerk of the corporation of the church, so there should not be a problem.

Report of the Pastor: Brian presented his plans for the annual meeting. He will present five options for the future of the church:

- 1. We would find a way to grow and continue as RVCC;
- 2. A shared ministry with another church;
- 3. A merger with another church, there are pluses and minuses, and time considerations;
- 4. A big farewell and we close our doors; and
- 5. His surprise, church in a new way and place, via zoom, because cost of building is prohibitive.

He will ask for show of hands that people can physically and emotionally support one of the options above, or we will have to close our doors. He will also ask for help, in some way, from everyone. Brian also presented possibilities of churches to merge with, in order of who we would contact first etc. They are Casco/Raymond Chapel, Windham Hills Church, Highland Lake Church, N. Windham Union Church, Gray UCC, New Gloucester Church, and North Gorham Church.

Agenda of the meeting was reviewed, logistics were reviewed, where to meet, when to have lunch, zoom etc.

Other Business: Weathervane will be printed hopefully on the 25th, deadline is this weekend. There was discussion of possibly having a Sweetheart Brunch, before or after church?? No final decision was made. The next meeting will be Tuesday, February 6, at 5PM, in person.

Pastor Brian offered a closing prayer.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 PM

MISSIONS CORNER

As the dust settles from the annual meeting, I want to let you know the details of our mission plans for 2024. First, Caryl Gilman is not listed as head of Missions, but she will certainly continue to be part of our mission efforts. Caryl, Pastor Brian, and I have met to discuss missions for 2024, and although there will be some changes, we will continue to be an active church where missions are concerned.

First, and most importantly, our efforts at the local level will continue much as they have in the past. We will continue to help our local food pantry in any way that we can. We will continue to work with the local schools to ensure that needy families have the help they need for Thanksgiving and Christmas. We will continue to provide funding to the local fire department to ensure that each home in Raymond has CO detectors. Our relationship with the Fuller Center will continue to be strong. We have paid our financial commitment to them for 2024. We will continue with our outreach at Christmas to Maine Seacoast Mission. We will continue to collect socks each year for the homeless in Portland through Grace Street Ministry. And we will continue to respond personally to each and every phone call for help which comes into the church office, should it be for food, heating, housing, or whatever. If we can not help them ourselves, we know the resources available in local communities, and will guide them accordingly.

In addition, through the Maine UCC Conference office, we can and will continue to respond quickly with \$\$ for disaster relief, either locally or globally. We will continue as a 5 for 5 church, supporting the four UCC special offerings, as well as the work of our Maine Conference, UCC. And through Church World Service, we will continue to provide School Kits and Hygiene Kits to those in need throughout the world.

I feel good about these plans, I feel that we are continuing with a strong mission program. I may need help, and I won't hesitate to ask.
