"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 4: 4-7

"Why Worry"

The Irish have a philosophy: why worry? 'Why indeed,' I used to think. But then I discovered that anxiety and fear are not something most people can simply turn off. Sometimes there are physical reactions to fear based influence that are completely involuntary. There are souls who need to run or fight or yes just stand there like a "deer in the headlights." Those are some of the ways that fear can affect us. Along with a whole slew of stress-based trauma due to that fear. Yet still I ask: why worry? Those words stick in my head today when I think of all the things that could come to be in our politics this year - in our church - or even in my life. I hear it like a mantra of Love: why worry? Then the philosophy permeates my fear-based responses and brings me a new peace and joy we all know in Christ because, really - why worry?

Obviously, the Apostle said it best to the Philippian church. He said, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything ...let your requests be made known to God." It seems like a simple practice, almost as simple as "why worry." But what if you cannot. What if you are the deer or the runner or the fighter avoiding the cause of your fear. What if it's a physical reaction to fear that cannot be helped? Why then? Are Paul's instructions helpful then? Truth is, they probably are not helpful at all. You may even want to give these worries to God but simply cannot be due to your natural fear reaction. And I am here to say: that is ok.

We have all been there at some time in our life, I believe. We have all felt the sting of worry and fear grip us, tight - tight enough to get stuck in one of the many fear responses. I know I have; but then I remembered: why *Continued next page . . .*

worry. And as I recalled the philosophy I chuckled - laughed even and then there was joy. It broke the spiral I was on and let me find my way back to finding solutions. The point, as you may guess, is not the philosophy itself - truly it's not even the idea of prayer, though that is a great way to achieve this separation from fear. Rather, it is what Paul tells us we will find - joy. "Rejoice in the Lord always." Whether your joy is reading a book, watching a Disney movie, going dancing. It does not matter - rejoice and the fear and anxiety will be weakened. Weakened enough that you can once again act without those fear responses holding you against your will. Or at least, that's what Paul seems to be saying to me - today. So, why worry, my friends, let's laugh in Joy with God instead - now and always.

I hope as the season of Lent ends, you can find your joy - joy enough to get past the worries and anxieties of this world. The fears that may be holding you back or keeping you in check. I hope for this healing boon for you, beloved, as we may soon be entering into a new phase in our merger. And this phase will be up to you and to all of us. We need to get to know our neighbors. We need to go to their church and worship with them and make opportunities for them to meet us. We need us all to participate in the coming weeks because we need to build relationships with these communities. So, I hope you will join me as we set out to rejoice in the Lord - set aside our worries - and yes give all to God through our prayers and requests - now and always.

The meeting was called to order by Tom Wiley on Monday, March 11, 2024, at 5PM, via zoom. Present were Tom, Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Deb, Brian and Judy.

Judy offered opening thoughts/prayer. The agenda was reviewed.

Reports of the Coordinators:

Treasurer: Brenda reported that financials look close to budget, cash looks good.

Pastor: Brian reported that things are running smoothly. Plans are going well for Holy Week. Caryl is working with Michael on music for Easter. We will have a 7 person choir for Maundy Thursday. Brian and Tom have a meeting after church, this coming Sunday, at Casco.

Clerk: nothing to report

Deacons: starting April 7, there will be a choice given in the bulletin for opening words of the Lord's Prayer, i.e. Our Father, Parent, Creator, God who art in Heaven. People may choose what they wish to say. Chan will be preaching that Sunday. Brian will be off on Sunday, April 7 and 14. Information about Easter flowers will be in the ACE.

Missions: Judy reported that we will be collecting for OGHS during the next couple of weeks.

Trustees: Rolf reported that he had completed the corporate filing for this year. He shared that he hopes to get the scouts going early with clean up in the parking lot. He was reminded that we need to redistribute the pile of reclaim at the top of the driveway by the door into the office.

Stewardship: Suggestion was made that we need to raise price to \$15 for pot roast dinners. Big cost is the meat. We also need more help, possibly Lions. Craig will come to our next meeting to discuss dinners.

Old Business: Rolf mentioned that the guy who bought parsonage had approached him about trimming some trees on property line along our parking lot. No one had a problem with this.

New Business: Brian is continuing to set up meetings with other churches, not a lot of feedback yet from the meetings that have already happened. These are preliminary meetings, it is too soon to come to any conclusions about them. After discussion, it was decided to print the Weathervane on Thursday, March 21.

Holy Week Easter Worship

Palm Sunday: This first day of Holy Week and the last Sunday of Lent commemorates Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Therefore, let us gather our Palms as we come into God's sanctuary; so, we may join in the celebration and wave these symbols of triumph as we gather for worship.

Raymond Village Community Church: 11 AM, March 24

Maundy Thursday: On the Thursday before Easter, we observe and participate in the sacrament of Holy Communion, recalling Jesus' first Eucharist during the Last Supper. This service will begin in the vestry and as the shadows grow, we will enter the sanctuary to conclude our worship.

Raymond Village Community Church: 6:30 PM, March 28

Good Friday: The Friday before Easter is the day where we remember when Jesus was crucified for our sins. From the early days of Christianity, Good Friday is observed as a day of sorrow, penance, and fasting.

We will have a time of open sanctuary. Where people may come to pray and reflect on what this time of darkness means to you and your faith. Throughout the sanctuary will be located the stations of the cross.

(evening): Casco Village Church: 6 PM, March 29


Easter: Our celebration of Jesus' Resurrection on the third day after his Crucifixion.
